

We could not send out a newsletter without addressing the issue that is affecting animal shelter/rescues nationwide: overpopulation of dogs and cats.

Shelters from coast to coast are over capacity with hundreds of animals still needing to be admitted and rehomed. The list for dogs and cats waiting to get into our shelter has reached an unbelievable high, while adoptions are at an all-time low.

How can YOU help?

Get your animals, as well as the strays that show up on your property and in your area, fixed. Have a neighbor whose cat or dog keeps having babies? Ask them if you can get their pet fixed for them. SCHS offers low-cost spay/neuter options to help with these expenses.

Try to re-home a stray while you wait for a spot in the shelter to open up. Utilize social media, the newspaper and word of mouth to find a home for the animal.

Now more than ever is a time for understanding, patience and kindness.

We are doing our best to find suitable homes for the animals in our care so that we can make room for those that still need our help. We appreciate your patience and understanding.
